In the Catechism of the Catholic Church we read #2179 - A parish is a definite community of the Christian faithful established on a stable basis within a particular church; the pastoral care of the parish is entrusted to a pastor as its own shepherd under the authority of the diocesan bishop." It is the place where all the faithful can be gathered together for the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist. The parish initiates the Christian people into the ordinary expression of the liturgical life: it gathers them together in this celebration; it teaches Christ's saving doctrine; it practises the charity of the Lord in the good works and brotherly love: "You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests." (St. John Chryostom)

The Collect asks God's care for his family, the Church, so that those who rely on God's grace may receive the shelter of God's protection. The Prayer over the Offerings juxtaposes earthly things and heavenly things: God gives us bread and wine to be our nourishment; in the Eucharist, these fruits of the earth become the sacrament of eternity.

We who share in the "one Bread and the one Chalice" must become one in Christ, working toward the salvation of all (Prayer after Communion. (LTP-2012)

In the liturgy the word God is speaking to this gathering of people. The more clearly readers understand what they are reading and believe in the message they are proclaiming, the more effectively God's word will be planted in the hearts of this assembly. Nourished by the word and led on by the Spirit, they take part in the liturgy of the Eucharist, better able to praise God for many great gifts, more ready to offer themselves as a living sacrifice, more willing to receive help to continue as witnesses this day by doing whatever God tells them in the Scriptures.
