#### Saint Sixtus, Saint Lawrence & Saint Pontian-Martyrs

Aug. 13th, Saint Pope Pontian ordained bishop in 231. In 235 he was banished to Sardinia by the Emperor Maximinus, along with the priest Hippolytus. Saint Sixtus ordained bishop of the Church of Rome in 257. 1 year after on Aug 6th he along with 4 deacons were put to death while carrying out the edict of the Emperor Valerian. 4 days later Saint Lawrence, deacon of the church of Rome became a martyr during the persecution of Valerian.

*1 Corinthians 6:12 "All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be enslaved by anything."*

Anything in moderation has its benefits. Coffee has antioxidants, helps burn fat, gives energy and even has some essential nutrients to name a few. But too much and you're looking at the opposite of the above, weight gain (due to spiked cortisol levels), adrenal fatigue and heart irritability to name a few. 1 cup=8 oz, 1-2 cups are considered beneficial and 2-4 cups, a safe amount. Obviously beneficial is best! Check your cup/travel mug size as most are 12-16oz.
