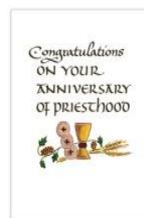

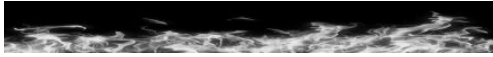

MIKKIE'S CORNER - Health & Nutrition

Electrolytes what are they...

The main electrolytes that have to do with fluid balance are Sodium, Chloride (often always found together as "table salt") and Potassium. These are the main ones you will find in supplementation or "sports drinks." You may notice mostly added salt and sugar in these drinks. The reason for this is one of the most important ways for sodium to be absorbed requires glucose (sugar) and the other way is in the colon where sodium (salt) is absorbed, resulting in water reabsorption. This reabsorption is important otherwise mass amounts of water would be lost in the feces causing dangerous dehydration and diarrhea. Potassium does the opposite by letting water go keeping this important balance between Sodium & Chloride and thus fluid regulation. Do you see now the importance of proper hydration (water and electrolytes) and how it may affect you? How much do you need....*continued*

Today May 13th, is Ascension of the Lord and World Communications Day:

Ascension Day is one of the earliest Christian festivals dating back to the year 68 CE. According to the New Testament in the Bible, Jesus Christ met several times with his disciples during the 40 days after his resurrection to instruct them on how to carry out his teachings. It is believed that on the 40th day he took them to the Mount of Olives, where they watched as he ascended to heaven.

Ascension Day marks the end of the Easter season and occurs ten days before Pentecost. Depending upon the phases of the Moon in a particular year, Ascension Day is usually celebrated on a Thursday. However, it has been reported that some Roman Catholic churches in Canada celebrate it on the following Sunday.

World Communications Day is a day where Catholics are invited to reflect upon the media of social communication (films, radio, television, newspapers, audiovisuals) and how these influence our lives. The media can promote values that lead to a more fully human society. The Church's ministry is twofold. The media can be used to help promote the Gospel. At the same time, as receivers of the materials presented by the media, the faithful have a duty to support and promote worthwhile presentations on media and reject those which promote values contrary to spiritual growth.
