MIKKIE'S HEALTH CORNER

continued from April 11th bulletin...

Alkaline, Anti-Inflammatory, Blood type

A pH of 0 is totally acidic, while a pH of 14 is completely alkaline and a pH of 7 is neutral.

Those levels vary throughout your body. Blood is slightly alkaline between a pH of 7.35 and 7.45 while your stomach is very acidic at a pH 3.5 or below so it can digest food. Our lungs and kidneys are largely responsible for blood pH levels and the kidneys control what is eliminated, which leaves us with our urine. This is why there are urine test strips to indicate pH levels.

This is largely to do with what we eat that determines this number. Based on the types of foods we eat, our body (and the kidneys in particular) needs to do more or less compensating for optimal pH. If you were to look at an alkaline food list, you will see lemons and limes on there. This may seem confusing, as lemons and limes are acidic. But again, it's all to do with the kidneys and the effect the particular food has on them. This is called the "potential renal acid load" or PRAL. Citrus fruits, although acidic, are considered alkaline, as they have a low renal acid load.
