11TH Sunday of Ordinary Time

First reading *Exodus 19.1-6a* Responsorial Psalm *Ps. 100.1-2, 3, 4, 5*

Second Reading *Romans 5.6-11* Gospel Reading *Matthew 9.36-10.8*

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Gospel reports that Jesus commissions twelve disciples. Many scholars believe that the twelve disciples symbolize the twelve tribes of Israel. It designates, therefore, continuity between Israel and the Church.

Matthew lists the names of the twelve disciples, as do Mark and Luke. Matthew also uses the word *apostle* when referring to the Twelve. The word *apostle* means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the twelve disciples are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission.

Dear Parents, Alumni, Parishioners, Friends, and Supporters of St. Ann's Academy,

For almost 150 years, St. Ann's Academy has been committed to providing exceptional Catholic education while serving as a gathering place for our Diocese and community. As we look toward the future, we are exploring opportunities to strengthen our facilities, enhance student experiences, and ensure our campus continues to meet the needs of future generations.

Twenty-five years ago, thanks in large part to the generosity of our community, we successfully completed a capital campaign that made possible the construction of our current elementary wing. Building on that legacy, the school is now considering a new series of significant capital investments over the coming years to address aging infrastructure and create lasting spaces that will benefit both our students and the wider community.

Current planning includes a proposed indoor athletic facility featuring an indoor soccer field, gymnasium, and flexible multi-purpose spaces designed for both school and community use. Additional priorities under consideration include roofing improvements, transportation upgrades, and other important infrastructure projects. Together, these potential investments are currently estimated at approximately \$15 million.

Over the past several years, substantial groundwork has been undertaken to explore these opportunities. We are now entering the next phase of that process through a fundraising feasibility study. To guide this work, St. Ann's Academy has engaged Compton Fundraising Consultants, an independent firm with extensive experience in capital campaign planning. The study will help us better understand community priorities, gauge interest in the proposed projects, and assess the potential for philanthropic support.

While it is anticipated that a combination of financing and philanthropy would be required to fund any future investments, the feasibility study will help determine the level of community support and inform future recommendations. In addition, new facility programming is expected to contribute to the long-term sustainability of both the school's mission and its facilities.

Before any decisions are made, the school is committed to listening to and learning from our community. Input from parents, alumni, donors, and community leaders will play an important role in shaping future plans. As part of the feasibility study, a cross-section of community members will be invited to participate in confidential interviews. If you receive an invitation, we encourage you to take part and share your insights, perspectives, and aspirations for the future of St. Ann's Academy.

We are deeply grateful for your continued support and look forward to hearing your thoughts as we explore how best to serve our students, families, and community for generations to come.
